Funds available are \$2580.86, fiscal year will end 6-30-16.

Purchase and sale agreement re: the building transfer to the Holden Historical Society, is still being reviewed by Attorney Dearborn. Kerry will contact to see where this stands.

The three bids to restore the buildings front doors were reviewed and discussed. It was voted to proceed with the House Revivers bid. Bunny will contact and Ben will coordinate . This will need to be completed by the end of fiscal year 2016.


The three bids to scrape and paint the building exterior were reviewed and discussed. It was voted to proceed with Colonial Painting Contractors. Bunny will contact, to inform re: timing of this project as it relates to passing of the Town Budget.

Ongoing business and projects were reviewed. Tom Copeland will replace the old back door as his schedule allows. Cookbook sales need to be revived for the upcoming summer months. Bunny will continue to check on the businesses that have them on sale. The pros and cons of a permanent Christmas tree were discussed, with it being tabled for now, with possible tree lighting and decoration contests to take place at the next tree lighting event. The Historical Society Supper and Talk were discussed. This event will take place on July 23rd, 2016.

A clean up day was scheduled for May 20, at 9A.M., and it was decided to tackle the landscaping. Ben Breadmore offered the remaining small gravel from another Town project to use as mulch, and all agreed that that would be ideal to keep the property looking nice.

The next meeting was scheduled for June 22, 2016, in the Town Council room at 9A.M. Meeting adjourned at 10 A.M.
