

Re: Farm Operators with Dry Wells, Small Businesses and Small Non-Profit Organizations

Farm operators, small businesses and small non-profit organizations in your municipality may call your office for direction on where to turn in the event of a dry well as a result of the drought conditions Maine is experiencing.

The U.S. Geological Survey reported that nearly the entire state is in some sort of hydrologic drought, with the southern two-thirds of the state showing surface water levels at the lowest ten percent of all data gathered over a period of 60-100 years. Groundwater levels for most of Maine are at the lowest 15 percent of all data gathered over the last 11-35 years.

The Secretary of Agriculture designated as primary natural disaster areas the counties of Androscoggin, Cumberland, Lincoln, Kennebec, Oxford, Sagadahoc and York. Franklin, Knox, Somerset and Waldo are named as contiguous disaster counties. This declaration makes farm operators eligible to be considered for assistance from the federal Farm Service Agency Disaster Assistance Program. The U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA) announced that federal Economic Injury Disaster Loans are available to small businesses, small agricultural cooperatives, small businesses engaged in aquaculture and private nonprofit organizations in Androscoggin, Cumberland, Oxford, Sagadahoc and York counties as a result of the drought.

- Contact 2-1-1 to report your dry well. This will allow the state to see how widespread this problem is.
