

TOWN WARRANT

To Chris Greeley, Police Chief of the Town of Holden, in the County of Penobscot:

Greetings:

In the name of the State of Maine you are hereby required to notify and warn the voters of the Town of Holden in said Penobscot County, qualified by law to vote in Town affairs, to meet at the Holden Municipal Building on Tuesday, June 13, 2017 at seven o'clock in the forenoon (7:00 a.m.), then and there to act on Articles 1 and 2 set out below:

And to notify and warn said voters to meet at the Holden Elementary School on Wednesday, June 14, 2017 at seven o'clock in the evening (7:00 p.m.), then and there to act on Article 3 through all of said Articles being set out as follows to wit:

ARTICLE 1. To choose a moderator to preside at said meeting.

ARTICLE 2. To elect all necessary Town Officials by secret ballot (Two Councilors, for three-year term; One School Administrative District 63 Directors for three year term).

Note: The polls for voting on Article 2 will be open from 7:00 a.m. until 8:00 p.m. on Tuesday June 13, 2017.

A person who is not registered as a voter may not vote in any election.




Note: § 5721-A (7) requires that the vote on the foregoing article must be by a written ballot.

ARTICLE 12. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Town Council to make transfers and disbursements from Undesignated Fund Balance, Reserve Funds, Trust Funds, Special Revenue Funds and Capital Improvement Funds for the purpose of local matching funds and other municipal purposes as voted by 3/5 of the members of the Council.




